Professional Development

On December 1, staff participated in a full-day in-service. During this time, teachers received F&P Benchmark training, special education teachers worked on DLM's, guidance counselors worked on the district counseling plan, and enrichment teachers articulated with Hammonton enrichment teachers. Media specialists took part in a Destiny webinar/training during this time, while aides either attended CPR training or participated in a webinar, "Early Number Concepts: Turning Misconceptions into Meaning." Looking ahead, the February 2 half-day in-service will be dedicated to Danielson training, and February 16 will focus on data, dyslexia, and differentiation.

Ashley Power offered two Wildcat Workshops in December with a focus on Miscue Analysis for grades K-3. This workshop served as a follow-up training for F&P procedures. Teachers learned more about current research in miscue analysis, as well as practicing analyzing miscues.

On December 5, 2017, Julie Lyons attended an ELA K-3 workshop for administrators and teachers, hosted by the NJDOE. Candice Michelini attended the same session later in the month as well. This workshop outlined the key components that the Department of Education encourages districts to work toward when developing their ELA curriculum, with a focus on best practices in ELA instruction. The key components discussed are grounded in a balanced literacy model, and many of the Department's recommendations and expectations align closely with WTSD's approach to ELA instruction.

Julie attended the South Jersey Data Specialists Partnership and Camden County Curriculum Consortium meetings this month. The Consortium enjoyed a presentation from Camden Public Schools, with tips for organizing curriculum items for QSAC reviews. Barrington and Berlin School Districts shared innovative practices they have implemented in their districts, including a partnership with the Army to become "iSTEAM Ready" and integrating STEAM into classrooms through coaching.

Standards-Based Report Card Update

During the 12/1 in-service, teachers had the opportunity to work with their grade-level colleagues to input report card grades into Real Time. Julie was available on 12/13/17 at WES from 6:00 - 8:00 PM for any additional parent questions about the SBRC's, and teachers were given several hard copies of the Math and ELA rubrics for any interested parents. Betty Scola posted the rubrics and sample report cards on the district website under the "Parents" tab.

Standardized Testing Update

Registration opened on December 11 for PARCC training (for Tech Coordinators and District Test Coordinators), and Julie and Mick registered for the training offered on March 8, 2018.
